

WCCC INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES

Contact with Warren County Community College (WCCC) should be initiated by the prospective student. Individuals, who wish to enroll as a student at WCCC, must complete the admission requirements and have all required documentation submitted to WCCC before the deadline dates indicated below:

On or before June 1st for fall admission

On or before November 1st for spring admission

Please note: the College will not process applications received or postmarked after the specified application deadline. Students transferring from a college or a university within the United States are granted an extension to June 15th for fall admission and November 15th for spring admission.

Requirements for students already in the United States with an F-1 Visa:

All documents submitted with the application must be *original* documents. The originals should be hand carried to the college; do not mail originals. Official transcripts should remain sealed to be opened by the International Advisor. The original documents will be copied and returned to you. Prospective students should begin the application process as soon as possible to allow sufficient time for review of the documents in order to issue a certificate of eligibility (I-20). WCCC policy requires proficiency in reading, writing, and speaking the English language prior to admission. The college does not offer English as a Second Language (ESL) classes to allow a student to be enrolled full-time.

Upon satisfactory completion of the following requirements, the student will be accepted for admission to WCCC and will be issued the I-20 Form, certifying the student's eligibility for F-1 status.

- Submit a completed WCCC Application for Admission including the one-time, non-refundable application fee of \$175.
- Complete an Affidavit of Support Form. A minimum of \$20,340 is required for tuition, fees, and living expenses while studying at WCCC. The amount would be less if the student plans to live with the sponsor. A WCCC Affidavit of Support must also be submitted.
- Submit a copy of the I-20 form from any U.S. college/university previously attended.
- Submit proof of English proficiency. The following may be used to show competency of the English language:
 - TOEFL - a minimum TOEFL score of 550 on the print-based exam; 213 on the computer-based exam; 80 on the inter-net based exam is required
 - IELTS - a minimum IELTS score of 6.0 is required
 - If either of these tests has not been taken, you may come to WCCC to take the ESL placement test through Accuplacer. You must score out of ESL classes.
- Request that an official transcript from each U.S. college/university previously attended be sent directly to the International Student Advisor in Student Services at WCCC. It may also be hand carried if sealed.
- Proof of immunization for measles, mumps, and rubella.

- Present a valid passport, visa stamp page, and I-94. The passport expiration date should be valid at least 6 months beyond semester start date.
- Sign and submit the WCCC Student Contract.

Submission of forged or altered documents will be reported to SEVIS and lead to dismissal.
