

WCCC INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES

Contact with Warren County Community College (WCCC) should be initiated by the prospective students. Currently, individuals who do not reside in the United States and wish to enroll as a student at WCCC, must complete the admission requirements and have all required documentation submitted to WCCC before the deadline dates indicated below:

On or before – June 1st for fall admission

On or before – November 1st for spring admission

Please note: The College will not process applications received or postmarked after the specified application deadline.

Requirements for students applying for F-1 status from their home country

Prospective students should begin the application process as soon as possible to allow sufficient time to compile the documents and print a certificate of eligibility (I-20). You may then present the I-20 to your consulate and apply for an F-1 Visa. WCCC policy requires proficiency in reading, writing, and speaking the English language prior to admission. The College does not offer English as a Second Language (ESL) classes that allow a student to be enrolled full-time.

Upon satisfactory completion of the following requirements the student will be accepted for admission to WCCC, and an I-20 form will be issued, certifying the student's eligibility for F-1 status.

- Submit a completed WCCC Application for Admission including the one-time, non-refundable application fee of \$175.
- Complete an Affidavit of Support (I-134), indicating your ability to cover your expenses while studying in the U.S. The form instructions will designate what documents you will need to provide. A WCCC Affidavit of Support must also be submitted.
- High school and college/university credentials from outside the U.S. must be evaluated by World Education Services, Inc. (WES). Request a document by document evaluation for a high school diploma and a course by course evaluation for college/university transcript.
- Complete the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and submit the results. A minimum TOEFL score of 550 on the print-based exam; 213 on the computer-based exam; 80 on the inter-net based exam is required. Or, complete the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) and submit the results. A minimum IELTS score of 6.0 is required. The WCCC reporting code is 2722.

- Proof of immunization for measles, mumps, and rubella
- Present a valid passport, visa stamp page, and I-94 arrival/departure card (both sides) valid upon arrival. The passport expiration date should be valid at least 6 months beyond the semester start date.
- Sign and submit the WCCC International Student Contract.
- Submit payment for one semester of full-time study at the current international tuition rate. The payment is refundable upon notification, prior to the first day of the semester, that the student will not attend WCCC.
- Copies of documents may be submitted via fax or e-mail with the application. **Original** documents must be presented upon arrival.

Submission of forged or altered documents will be reported to SEVIS and lead to dismissal.
