Using the Internet for ACADEMIC Research

- We like the Internet because...
 - It's fast
 - It's fun
 - It tells you what's going on
 - It's available everywhere
- However...
 - Not always reliable or timely
 - Not unbiased
 - Not edited or fact checked

This actually makes using the Internet for ACADEMIC research harder!



...for **ACADEMIC** Research

When using the Internet, **you** must critically evaluate websites based on:

1. **Who**

Publisher? Writer? Expertise?

2. **Why**

Biased? Purpose?

3. **When**

Dates? Updates?




Database Access

- User Name: (first initial, last name)
- Password: (whatever you made up)

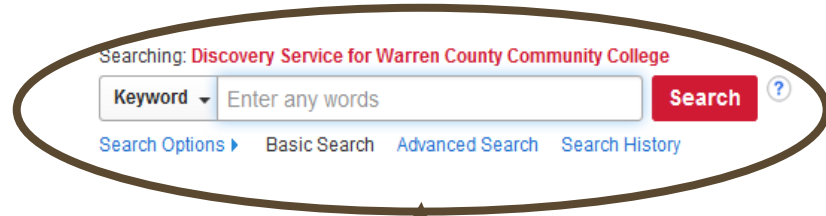

Use this search box just as you would when performing a Google search.

Keep in mind:

The more specific your **search sting**, the fewer results you will get
Try to search using broad terms to start
i.e. use "learning disorders" before using "teaching children with Dysgraphia"

Search String:
A **string** refers to a sequence of characters, words, or other elements that are connected to each other in some way. A **search string** usually refers to a **string** of words or a phrase that is used to search and locate or retrieve a specific piece of information contained in a database or a set of documents.

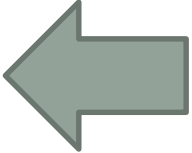

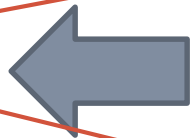

Ways you can refine your search

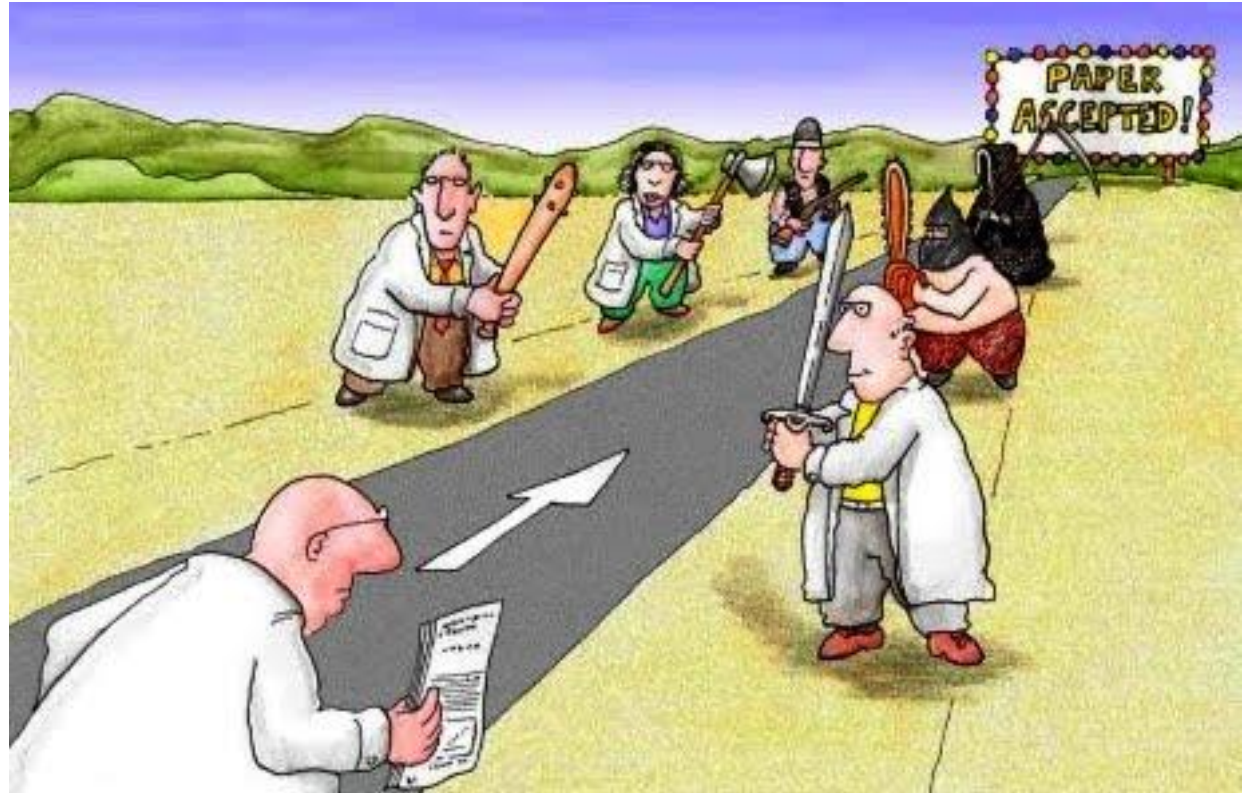
Scholarly or Peer Reviewed
Very important for academic research!



Scholarly? Peer-Reviewed?

“In academic publishing, the goal of **peer review** is to **assess the quality** of articles submitted for publication in a scholarly journal.

Because a peer-reviewed journal will not publish articles that fail to meet the standards established for a given discipline, peer-reviewed articles that are accepted for publication exemplify the best research practices in a field.”

WCCC'S Expectations

- Student Rights, Responsibilities and Academic Conduct
- 304.2 WCCC Standards of Academic Conduct
 - Students are expected to attend every class meeting.
 - Students are expected to be prepared for every class meeting and to make up any missed assignments.
 - Students are obligated to extend to one another and to faculty respect and courtesy as members of the College community.
 - Students have an obligation to conduct their academic activities honestly and conscientiously. They should:
 - Follow the content and procedures as outlined in the course syllabus.
 - Receive grades based on fair, unbiased evaluation instruments without regard to race, color, sex, sexual orientation, religion, age, military status, national origin, disability, or marital status.
 - Submit work on time as determined by the instructor.
 - **Give appropriate recognition by name for their contributions to published material. Each course syllabus will contain the institutional policy on plagiarism.**
 - Respect the confidentiality of information regarding other students that is contained in any college records. Such information shall not be released, except by the College Registrar with the student's consent, or as otherwise required by law.
 - Refrain from reference during examinations or other academic evaluative processes to other individuals or materials not authorized by the instructor.
- In addition, they shall not:
 - Possess, purchase, sell, or use any materials intended to be part of or the whole of an examination or other evaluation process unless authorized to do so by the instructor.
 - Act as substitutes for other students in any evaluative process.
 - Avail themselves of aid in any manner expressly prohibited by the instructor in the research, preparation, creating, writing, or performing of work to be submitted for academic credit or evaluation.
 - Aid other students in a manner expressly prohibited by the instructor in the research, preparation, creating, writing, or performing of work to be submitted for academic credit or evaluation.
 - **Present as their own academic work ideas or work of another person without proper acknowledgment of sources.**

Violation of these rules can lead to a failure for a course and/or expulsion from the College.

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WHAT IS PLAGIARISM?

Deliberate Plagiarism

- Rewriting from books or articles
- copying & pasting from web pages and online sources to create a patchwork writing
- buying, downloading, or borrowing a paper

(What is Plagiarism)

Accidental Plagiarism

- not knowing when & how to cite
- not knowing how to paraphrase or summarize
- not knowing what “common knowledge” is
- recycling an old paper



To Avoid Plagiarism

Always include an in-text citation

(Author's Last Name, Year, p. #)

AND

Always have a References page at the end of your work

Author, A. A. (Year of publication). *Title of work: Capital*

letter also for subtitle. Location: Publisher.
