PRECISION AG BUSINESS CERTIFICATE

The following three courses will equip students with a practical understanding of best practices, technology utilization in agriculture, and the history and future of precision agriculture. Coursework involves hands-on activities in the field and with VRA/VRT. Co-requisite: FAA Part 107 Drone Pilot Certificate (recommended).

UXS FOR PRECISION AGRICULTURE


