

- Preferred: Full-time enrollment (at least 12 credits per semester):
 - o If Part-Time, meet with the EOF Coordinator.
- Must attend a mandatory Orientation and/or Summer Scholars Bridge Program

- Gross income and assets must fall within the above criteria
- Demonstrate an educationally and economically challenging background
- Be a New Jersey Resident for 12 consecutive months prior to receiving the award
 - Must apply and be accepted to Warren County Community College
- Must file Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the New Jersey Alternative Financial Aid Application
- Meet the academic criteria of Warren County Community College.

- Apply to Warren County Community College
- Complete an EOF Application
- Submit completed and signed application to eofp@warren.edu

- After your interview you will receive and you've been accepted, you will receive a contract to complete and return as well as the next steps
- You will then be invited to attend the EOF Summer Scholars program if you are a new WCCC student
